



The José Milton Foundation Advancing Women in STEM Scholarship Information for Applicants, 2024

The José Milton Foundation Advancing Women in STEM Scholarship seeks to encourage academically talented and highly motivated Girl Scouts who are active in Girl Scouts of Tropical Florida and earning a Gold Award in a STEM area to pursue a degree/career in a STEM field. Typically, students earning a Bachelor's degree in a STEM-related field are highly employable and well-prepared to enjoy career success and increased salary potential. Women are underrepresented in STEM fields. By offering this Scholarship, the José Milton Foundation aims at greater diversity within the STEM workforce and STEM leadership.

A STEM Scholarship of \$2,500 will be awarded to one or more qualified candidates. All Scholarship monies will be given to the student awardee through the Girl Scouts.

Criteria for Selection:

- 1. Applicant must be active in Girl Scouts of Tropical Florida for at least three years and must exemplify the Girl Scouts values of courage, confidence, leadership, and character.
- 2. Applicant must have earned/be in the process of earning a Gold Award based on a STEM project and provide (1) a short 3-minute video describing the Project and (2) title and a written abstract, limited to 250 words.
- For 2024 Scholarship: She must be in her junior or senior year of high school in a Miami-Dade or Monroe school and must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale).
 (a) Applicant who is a Senior must be accepted to an accredited science, technology, engineering, or math program at a post-secondary institution in the US that will lead to a Bachelor's Degree. The applicant's declared major must fall within a STEM-related field.
 (b) Applicant who is a Junior must indicate that she plans to choose a STEM-related major at an accredited post-secondary institution.
- 4. Applicant must answer the following prompts, limited to 250 words each:
 - Girl Scouts has prepared me for a career in STEM by...
 - My 5-year plan to pursue a STEM career... (outline your academic/personal/volunteer goals leading to the start of your career)

Deadline for Submission of the Application Packet is April 30, 2024. Top candidates will be called back for a virtual interview in early May, and **José Milton Foundation Advancing Women in STEM Scholarship** Awardees will be announced during the Girl Scouts High Awards Ceremony on June 9.
